
Dear Friends,

As the New Year begins we have much to share with you who uphold us in prayer. 2010 was the fourteenth year that we have been officially serving the Lord in this ministry and it has been full of adventures and blessings. Trips to Cameroon, Mexico (Hermosillo), Mexico (Monterrey), the Philippines, the Dominican Republic, India and Southeast Asia brought medical care and the gospel to hundreds in need this past year. We have had countless answers to prayer, whether it was baggage or customs fees that were waived, permission to practice granted, needed personnel and funds provided or God opening hearts to faith in His Son. God has also blessed us personally, carrying us through Jennifer's father's death, making us foster grandparents and slowly restoring Jennifer's strength after a hospital stay.

In November, a team of three made the very long trip (over forty hours total) to Northeastern India to help in a small Christian hospital in a rural area. Christians are a small minority in India and it was a privilege to encourage and help these brothers and sisters in their outreach there. December brought a rescheduled trip to a Southeast Asian country.

They will return, Lord willing on February 6<sup>th</sup>. Please pray that the gospel will go forth with power and that many could be helped. February will find us in Mexico, back in the Hermosillo area for a week as we reach out into outlying villages. We would appreciate your prayers for safety and God's working there. March is the scheduled month for a return trip to the island nation of Yap. Exciting things are happening in Yap and its outer islands and souls are being saved. We ask once again for your intercession - that God might work in hearts in each of these locations and also for those traveling, as these will be busy months of service.

We thank each of you who have prayed for this ministry in the past year. We count you as our dear friends and a much needed part of the GDM Missions team. You have helped so many to hear of God's love and sacrifice for them. Please continue to pray.
