Plans are already being discussed for a return to Cameroon in 2013, likely reaching out into some new, mostly unevangelized areas.

A fuel shortage in Micronesia may cause some problems for the team if not alleviated. Please pray that the plane would be able to fly the team to the islands they have gained permission to travel to.

Thanks so much for being a part of our adventures! We are so grateful for your help in enabling us to do this work. It is great to be able to share with you who pray for us what God is doing. Even now we are looking beyond Yap to the Philippines where our team will be ministering in May for two and half weeks and then the Caribbean island of Dominica in June. We covet your prayers.
