


Thanks for praying for us over the past few months. They have been full of activity and blessing! In our last letter we wrote of some needed items we had picked up for our ministry at the Medical Missions for Christ (MMFC) warehouse. How God has used that ministry to supply our needs! In April we were back there with a trailer to pick up the ultrasound machine that MMFC was giving us for the Benin Clinic. Pastor Turner (of MMFC) also surprised us with two new 3500 watt generators for the clinic. These will be so greatly used! Some have asked about needed equipment items for the clinic and there is a list at Beninclinic.org for anyone who is interested. In addition, we would like to get a used digital X-ray system for the dental clinic there. We would appreciate prayer for these needs.

You might remember that our trip to Southeast Asia that was scheduled for March was cancelled due to a death in the missionaries' family. That trip has been rescheduled for November if we are able to receive approval to practice dentistry in a new location. This left us with a gap in our schedule that we have filled by visiting new churches. We also were able to fit in a mission conference at one of our supporting churches in Maine and attend Gospel Fellowship Association's retreat at the Wilds in NC. We have now just returned from a conference in Chesapeake, VA. We have enjoyed all these times of interaction, instruction, and fellowship and are glad we could be part of them before we start a very busy time of ministry for us.

On July 1st (1-21) GDMMissions will send a team of two (us!) to Micronesia to follow up with the believers there after the typhoon that took place in March. We will be working in the Chuuk Islands, on the islands of Weno, Fefen, and Tonoas. In March, Category Five Typhoon Maysak roared through Micronesia devastating both the Chuuk and Yap Islands with powerful winds and storm surge. GDMMissions sent a team to help the inhabitants of the Yap islands and especially the church planters we have helped to establish

on these tiny islands. The team was well received and did much physical labor to help the people who had lost absolutely everything. As people questioned why God had allowed this to happen to them it was a good opportunity to share the gospel which was also well received. Each person received a Bible

in their own language as well. We will be following the relief team with dental care in the Chuuk Islands accompanied with gospel preaching. Please pray that these people who have been greatly impacted by this devastating storm will respond to God's Word as it is preached.

Two weeks after we return from Micronesia, Jack will be part of a team that travels to Benin, West Africa. On this team will be a dentist, a medical student, a pharmacist and his wife, two medical doctors and two nurses plus our team leader. If the clinic building is completed in time, this team will be the first to work in it! How we thank the Lord for all He has allowed to be accomplished there! There is still finish work that will need to be done inside and equipment that has not yet been provided but by God's grace, the roof will be on and the building will be ready to be used. Dr. Steve and Katrina Boutrus will be able to view the clinic they are planning to staff full time, Lord willing in late 2016. "Ah, Lord God! Behold, thou hast made the heaven and the earth by Thy great power and stretched out arm, and there is noth-

ing too hard for Thee" Jeremiah 32:17.

In September (Sept.19-Oct. 3rd), we will travel to Cameroon, West Africa, along with dental assistant Nina Minka. There we will provide dental care to support the evangelistic work

Please pray for God's grace and strength to do the work and be a true help both to the missionaries we will be supporting and to the people who so badly need care. We know we can't do this without prayer help even as we strive to be faithful in this work.
